Recent Events

USSTRATCOM/SMA Academic Alliance Speaker Series:

(30 Mar) Dr. Matt Kroenig of Georgetown University gave a talk on his latest book, *"The Logic of American Nuclear Strategy,"* for the fifth session of our speaker series. His talk articulated that what sets American nuclear strategy apart from other nuclear powers is counterforce targeting and extended deterrence. Second-strike theory is not sufficient, and that gap would be filled by a nuclear superiority-brinkmanship synthesis theory.

Dr. Kroenig is an Associate Professor in the Department of Government and the Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University and a Senior Fellow in the Brent Scowcroft Center on International Security at The Atlantic Council.

Recent Events (continued)

USSTRATCOM/SMA Academic Alliance Speaker Series:

(17 Apr) Kristin Ven Bruusgaard presented on "*The Politics of Russian Nuclear Strategy*." Her conclusions from research into Russian nuclear strategy are that the military dominates, implying limits to Putin's power. There also has been a militarization of Russian foreign and security policy.

Ms. Ven Bruusgaard is a Stanford fellow at the Center for International Security and Cooperation pursuing a M.Phil/Ph.D. student in Defence Studies at King's College London and has been a senior advisor on security policy with the Norwegian Armed Forces.

(23 May) Dr. Jacquelyn G. Schneider presented a teleconference titled "*Cyber and Cross-Domain Deterrence*" that explored at what point cyber attacks on critical infrastructure becomes a national security problem and when DoD should get involved. She argued that while there is a large role for deterrence, whole of government should consider and prioritize what is valued most in cyberspace and what instruments of power should be employed to retain that.

Dr. Schneider is an Assistant Professor at the U.S. Naval War College and a core faculty member of the Center for Cyber Conflict Studies.

Stanford Center for International Security and Cooperation (CISAC) Fellows (14-15 May). Fellows were briefed on the global mission and history of USSTRATCOM, strategic planning, laws of armed conflict, nuclear modernization, and cybersecurity. The fellows were also able to visit the Global Operations Center and Battle Deck. Research presentations by Stanford Fellows were well defined in scope and relevant to USSTRATCOM mission areas. Stanford Fellows that presented their research at USSTRATCOM included Dr. Eric M in, Dr. Sarah Shirazyan, Dr. Steven Ward, Dr. Anna Weichselbraun, Kristin Ven Bruusgaard, and Dr. Max Smeets.

There were insightful conclusions in the fellows' presentations on the relationship between negotiations, battles, and overall conflict outcomes; on the failures inherent in the design of UN Resolution 1540 on countering WMD and how to remedy it; and on the dominant influence of the military over civilians as regards Russian nuclear strategy.

Recent Events (continued)

(27 Mar) Advanced Strategic Leadership Studies Program (ASLSP) at the School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS) at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. Students from ASLSP visited USSTRATCOM as part of their fieldwork for their 24-month senior level course. They received briefings from USSTRATCOM leaders and staff on the command's mission areas, deterrence and assurance, planning perspectives and space policy. They also participated in a seminar-style Q&A about recent national level guidance.

(16-17 Apr) Art of War Scholars from Army Command and General Staff College (CGSC). Eleven students along with their instructor, Dr. Dean Nowowiejski, the Ike Skelton Distinguished Chair for the Art of War Studies, visited USSTRATCOM. They met with Chief of Staff, MG Daniel Karbler and toured the Global Operations Center and received briefings on the command's history and mission areas. Other topics covered during their briefings included deterrence, an overview of planning, and a space policy brief.
