**USSTRATCOM/J5** Addresses Great Plains National Security Education Community at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln (2 Nov 16). Gen Crosier, Mr. McKenna, and Mr. Florick met with students and faculty of the Great Plains National Security Education Community for two important events intended to shape student research projects for the 2016-2017 academic year. Each of four student team briefed the concepts for their research projects to the visitors from STRATCOM. The projects were titled: (1) "Arms Control and the Future", (2) "The Future of Partnerships and Alliances", (3) "Empirical Deterrence: A Methodology to Evaluate and Test Deterrence Campaigns", and (4) "Deterrence: Ramifications of Chinese Expansion for Regional US Allies". Each team presented for 30 minutes during which time they explained their projects and received recommendations on how to refine them. Gen Crosier capped the evening by leading a 75-minute discussion on the multiple missions assigned to USSTRATCOM, the global challenges facing the US, and how the students can advance new ideas to address the security challenges. The students are working on timelines to present their papers at the Mar 17 DAAA Conference at Creighton and to submit them to the Gen Welch Deterrence Writing Competition.


Gen Crosier Addresses Great Plains National Security Education Community at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln

**USAF 8th Annual National Security Scholars Conference at Columbia University (13 Oct 2016).** Gen Crosier teamed with a panel of experts for a focused discussion on the topic of "Uncertain Futures and the Implications for National Security." During his remarks, Gen Crosier provided his perspectives on Secretary Carter's and Chairman Dunford's recently described "4+1 Problem Set" (Russia, China, North Korea, Iran & Violent Extremist Organizations), as well as a variety of functionally defined issues and USSTRATCOM's approaches and initiatives to address them. The visit to Columbia University also included separate discussions on the Academic Alliance and opportunities for the university and the Command to collaborate.

**Deterrence & Assurance Document Repository.** From the very beginning of planning for the Academic Alliance, an important element of it has been the establishment of an accessible document repository for research papers and other documents focused on the wide array of open D&A issues. As the DAAA Annual Conference and various collaborative research projects are showing, alliance members are conducting critical and strategic thought. The goal of the repository is to archive their important work and share it with not only other researchers, but also with practitioners and policy makers. Within the next few weeks, we will activate a new repository tab on the DAAA website that will enable you to access the documents stored there. Although we're collecting previously written papers, we're excited about entering your current works in progress once completed. **Maj Gen Crosier Addresses Air War College Class of 2017 (12 Jan 17).** Gen Crosier travelled to Maxwell AFB, AL to speak with the assembled study body of AWC Class of 2017 as part of the Commandant Lecture Series. The study body includes 45 international officers from six continents. Although the lesson plan was originally intended to focus on Nuclear Global Strike, Gen Crosier expanded his remarks to educate the students on how deterrence concepts and USSTRATCOM have evolved from the Cold War to the 21st Century, a review of global challenges, and a discussion of current activities directed in the Deterrence & Assurance Campaign Plan. **USSTRATCOM Leadership Visit to Stanford University (24 Jan 17).** Gen Hyten will conduct the next in the continuing round of discussions with faculty and students at Stanford University and the Center for International Security and Cooperation (CISAC). The Stanford delegation is comprised of senior security experts such as Sec George Schultz, Sec Condoleeza Rice, Sec William Perry, AMB Mike McFaul, Dr. Amy Zegart, and Dr. David Relman. The 1-day agenda includes faculty presentations of ongoing research, a public talk on space, counterspace, and deterrence by Gen Hyten, and an open discussion between Gen Hyten and research fellows.

**2017 DAAA Conference & Workshops (9-10 Mar 17).** In less than two months, Creighton University will host the 2nd annual DAAA Conference & Workshops on its campus in Omaha. The theme is "Rethinking Deterrence and Assurance in a Globalized World." Dr. Rebecca Murray (Associate Dean of Social & Applied Sciences, College of Arts & Sciences) is leading the effort at Creighton. Although planning is ongoing, the review committee received approximately 20 abstracts by aspiring panel presenters. Results of the abstract review process will be released soon, along with the finalized list of keynote speakers and workshop topics.
