### **Brigadier General Kenneth S. Eaves**

#### **Mobilization Assistant to the Deputy Commander**

Brigadier General Kenneth S. Eaves serves as the Mobilization Assistant to the Deputy Commander, United States Strategic Command at Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska. He is the principal advisor to the deputy Commander on Reserve Component matters related to the Command's diverse missions, including strategic deterrence; cyberspace operations; integrated missile defense; intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance; and global strike.

After receiving his commission from the Academy of Military Science in 1990, General Eaves began his military career as an F-15 pilot in the Georgia ANG's 116th Tactical Fighter Wing. He subsequently transferred to the Missouri ANG's 131st Fighter Wing in 1995 where he flew the F-15 and B-2. While assigned to the 131st, General Eaves has held various positions, including command at the squadron, group and wing level. As a command pilot, he has flown nearly 3,500 flying hours, including combat time during Operation NORTHERN WATCH and Operation PROVIDE COMFORT.
